Any time you're diving 1,000 feet or more above sea level, you're altitude diving. If you want to safely explore the hidden world of a mountain lake, the PADI Altitude Diver Specialty course is for you.

The Altitude Diver Specialty course familiarizes you with the rules and procedures necessary to use the Recreational Dive Planner or your personal dive computer at altitude. This includes:

- Altitude dive planning, organization, procedures, techniques, problems and hazards
- Special Recreational Dive Planner procedures for diving at altitude
- Safety stops and emergency decompression procedures
- Special equipment necessary for altitude diving
